Organization Overview

Mahala's Hope is a nonprofit organization whose primary purpose is to assist women in recovery from substance abuse and trauma, which may include physical/sexual violence, childhood trauma and/or trauma stemming from their addictions. Primarily helping women (age 18 and older) after they have already received primary rehabilitation, Mahala's Hope serves as a stepping-off point before they return to their communities with renewed confidence and can live independently. The on-site counselor helps them create individual treatment plans. Mahala's Hope meets the specific needs of the clients and works with them to develop personalized strategies, always endeavoring to uncover and understand why they make the choices they make.

Mahala's Hope created a transitional recovery residence to fill a gap in services available in the region. While many primary-care services, such as 30-day treatment programs, exist throughout Wisconsin, many women recovering from drug and/or alcohol abuse — and the trauma associated with that — need a place to prepare for their return home so they reduce their risk of relapse. The residence facility itself features a family-like setting located in a rustic, nature-enriched area. The clients often form a sisterhood, finding camaraderie while building support systems during their time together. Activities include yoga and meditation, experiential art, group therapy, gardening, cooking, and other contributions to the welfare of the house.

Mahala's Hope takes a strength-based and holistic approach to treatment, providing physical, emotional, psychological, and spiritual care. Our remote, rural setting immerses our clients in nature — from our horses and surrounding wildlife to flowerbeds and vegetable gardens to sunsets and serenity — all of which help the women with meditative mindfulness. Mahala's Hope offers equine experiential learning and believes working with horses is a powerful and effective method for a person to gain emotional insight, leading to healthy changes in attitudes and behaviors. Partnering with horses inspires healing and growth, an understanding of who we are, and how we will be able to integrate this knowledge in our lives. Mahala's Hope also offers equine experiential workshops to various populations, including vicarious trauma groups and corporate teams, as well as outpatient counseling.

Position Overview

- Experience in volunteer and/or Board of Director partnerships is desirable.


